Upon graduation you receive a Bachelor of Science degree and a commission as an officer in the United States Air Force. Your commitment to serve will be at least 5 years.

#### **ACADEMIC PREPARATION**

For admission to the Academy, we consider your high school grades, class standing and SAT or ACT scores. Both the SAT and ACT can be taken as many times as possible before the application deadline — we only count your highest scores on each test. Your school counselor can provide you with national test dates and scheduling information. To prepare academically for the Academy, we encourage you to continually improve upon your study habits. Also, tell us if you take honors or advanced placement classes, or participate as an exchange student.

# **ACADEMY STATS**

To be eligible for the Academy, you must

- A U.S. citizen
- Unmarried with no dependents
- Of good moral character
- At least 17, but less than 23 years of age by July 1 of the year you will enter

To be academically competitive for an Academy appointment, we recommend you complete the following high school courses at a minimum:

- Four years of English (with a college prep class in writing)
- Four years of college-prep math (strong background in geometry, algebra, trigonometry and precalculus)
- Four years of lab-based science (should include biology, chemistry and physics)
- Three years of social studies (to include a course in U.S. history)
- Two years of a modern foreign language


